## A RESOLUTION

1 Creating the Senate Reducing Georgia's Cost of Doing Business Study Committee; and for

- 2 other purposes.
- 3 WHEREAS, Georgia has been ranked the number one state to do business for six years in
  4 a row by *Site Selection Magazine*; and

5 WHEREAS, Georgia must continue to be at the forefront in creating a business friendly6 environment; and

7 WHEREAS, the rising costs of goods and services threaten families, small and large8 businesses, economic development, and all Georgia consumers; and

9 WHEREAS, Georgia has some of the highest auto insurance rates in the nation, which not

10 only hurts individuals, but any industry that has extensive fleet and commercial vehicle

11 operations; and

12 WHEREAS, rural healthcare providers face an ongoing financial crisis, threatening access

- 13 to all patients in their communities; and
- WHEREAS, healthcare costs continue to increase due in part to the practice of defensivemedicine; and
- WHEREAS, Georgia ranks 40th in the state lawsuit climate report published by the Institutefor Legal Reform; and
- 18 WHEREAS, the General Assembly needs to fully review and study the issue of Georgia's
- 19 legal climate and its impact on the cost of doing business and performing healthcare services
- 20 in Georgia.

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21	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE:
22	(1) Creation of Senate study committee. There is created the Senate Reducing
23	Georgia's Cost of Doing Business Study Committee.
24	(2) Members and officers.
25	(A) The committee shall be composed of 15 members to be appointed by the
26	Lieutenant Governor as follows:
27	(i) The chairperson of the Senate Agriculture and Consumer Affairs Committee;
28	(ii) Five members of the Senate of whom at least one member will have a
29	professional background in healthcare, at least two members will be an attorney and
30	at least one member shall be appointed from the minority party;
31	(iii) A citizen representative who is a member of the Georgians First Commission;
32	(iv) A citizen representative who is a small business owner, in consultation with the
33	state director of the National Federation of Independent Businesses;
34	(v) A citizen representative who works in the agriculture industry;
35	(vi) A citizen representative who works in the forestry industry, in consultation with
36	the Georgia Forestry Association;
37	(vii) A citizen representative who is licensed to practice medicine in the State of
38	Georgia and is currently practicing as a physician, in consultation with the Medical
39	Association of Georgia;
40	(viii) A citizen representative who works in the property and casualty insurance
41	industry;
42	(ix) A citizen representative who works in the medical malpractice insurance
43	industry;
44	(x) A citizen representative who is admitted to practice law in the State of Georgia
45	and who predominantly represents defendants in tort liability cases in their practice;
46	and
47	(xi) A citizen representative who is admitted to practice law in the State of Georgia
48	and who predominantly represents plaintiffs in tort liability cases in their practice.
49	(B) The chairperson of the Senate Agriculture and Consumer Affairs Committee shall
50	serve as chairperson of the committee.
51	(C) The committee may establish various subcommittees with subject matter expertise
52	to advise the committee on specific matters, which shall be chaired by a member of the
53	study committee.
54	(3) <b>Powers and duties.</b> The committee shall undertake a study of the conditions, needs,
55	issues, and problems mentioned above or related thereto and recommend any action or
56	legislation which the committee deems necessary or appropriate.

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- 57 (4) Meetings. The chairperson shall call all meetings of the committee. The committee
  58 may conduct such meetings at such places and at such times as it may deem necessary or
  59 convenient to enable it to exercise fully and effectively its powers, perform its duties, and
  60 accomplish the objectives and purposes of this resolution.
- 61 (5) Allowances, expenses, and funding.
- 62 (A) The legislative members of the committee shall receive the allowances provided
  63 for in Code Section 28-1-8 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated.
- (B) Members of the committee who are not legislators, state officials, or state
  employees shall receive a daily expense allowance in an amount the same as that
  specified in subsection (b) of Code Section 45-7-21 of the Official Code of Georgia
  Annotated, as well as the mileage or transportation allowance authorized for state
  employees.
- (C) The allowances authorized by this resolution shall not be received by any member
  of the committee for more than five days unless additional days are authorized. Funds
  necessary to carry out the provisions of this resolution shall come from funds
  appropriated to the Senate.
- 73 (6) **Report.**
- (A) In the event the committee adopts any specific findings or recommendations that
  include suggestions for proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file a report of the
  same prior to the date of abolishment specified in this resolution, subject to
  subparagraph (C) of this paragraph.
- (B) In the event the committee adopts a report that does not include suggestions for
  proposed legislation, the chairperson shall file the report, subject to subparagraph (C)
  of this paragraph.
- 81 (C) No report shall be filed unless the same has been approved prior to the date of 82 abolishment specified in this resolution by majority vote of a quorum of the committee.
- A report so approved shall be signed by the chairperson of the committee and filed with
- 84 the Secretary of the Senate.
- 85 (D) In the absence of an approved report, the chairperson may file with the Secretary
- 86 of the Senate a copy of the minutes of the meetings of the committee in lieu thereof.
- 87 (7) **Abolishment.** The committee shall stand abolished on December 1, 2019.
